




Painting continues on the rides in Planet Snoopy and the park expects to make another announcement very soon!

RUNNING WILD!

Saturday, May 1, 2010
(bonus day Sunday, May 2)

It's time to go wild again in Valdosta. After over \$1 million in renovations to *Cheetah*, the park's wooden coaster wonder, a year of first ride privileges for ACE members, and the ACE Con in 2008, ACE Southeast returns to enjoy the rides at **Wild Adventures** in Valdosta, Georgia.

Saturday starts out with a group photo before getting the first rides on *Cheetah*. Note that this is a regular benefit for ACE members. After that attendees are free to explore the remainder of the park, including 9 roller coasters, all day enjoying "bottomless drinks" to quench their thirsts. And when they get hungry they can use their included meal ticket and choose from one of the several eateries in the park.

At the end of the day, while security is closing down and securing the park and animals for the night, everyone will get a chance to meet members of the Wild Adventures staff.

Finally, after the lights have been shut off on *Cheetah*, it will be time for ERT on *Cheetah*, *Hangman*, the Vekoma suspended looping coaster, along with the three new rides for this year including both a family coaster and flying scooters.

Attendees can return on Sunday with an included bonus admission day. And if you want to return more times during the year event tickets can be upgraded to a GOLD Season Pass for an additional \$30.

All this spells a great May day for only \$50 for an ACE member, or \$55 guests. Members with a Wild Adventures Season Pass can attend for just \$18. But hurry, registration closes April 16, the day after "tax day".



I did not start out as a roller coaster person. I have been and always will be a public relations person. But being a PR person at an automobile plant means becoming somewhat of an expert on cars. PR people at hospitals must know a great deal about healthcare in order to speak the language of the reporters and other key constituencies they deal with.

At Six Flags I learned quickly about the business and was quickly able to talk the talk of the theme park industry. But Robert was the one that actually turned me into a coaster fan.

I remember one of our first conversations Robert asked what my favorite SFOG coaster was. Wanting to impress I said "The Ninja," recalling my teenage years of the early 90's when that coaster was the latest and greatest. I was shy to admit I had not yet ridden all of the rides at the park.



Robert giggled a little that day on the phone, but was very polite. During one of our first face-to-face meetings a few months later we rode several of the other coasters at the park. He casually recalled my remark and asked if I wanted to recant my position. I did!

It was Robert's vision that brought about what we now call Spring Fling. He came to me with the idea and I have to say, I wasn't quite sure it could be done. But he helped me put together a plan that we later presented to John Odum (then the GM). He bought it and we had roughly 30 people for Spring Fling 2003.

The next year Melinda Ashcraft was our GM. I wasn't sure how the plan would fly with the new boss. She not only accepted, she upped the ante with more food, more ERTs and more surprises! We more than doubled our numbers that year as I recall.

Through the years Robert was not only a close confidant that always seemed to know more about the park than I did, but a good friend too. I still remember a very soggy morning around 3 a.m. when we had run the Scream Machine only half of its 30-hour marathon in 2003. I was exhausted and frustrated. The weather was horrible; the ACEs were dropping one-by-one and worst of all it looked like we had deceased ex-mayor and ex-congressman news to compete with that next morning in the media. Things couldn't be much worse.

But as I sat there huddled under USA Games Whack-A-Mole, Robert came by to cheer me up and suggested that I take a few spins to help cheer up the guys out there on the tracks. It seemed to help the ACEs quite a bit and gave them a second wind. But I think he also knew that it would give me the boost I needed to get through the following day. It did. And I think that's the moment I really "got" ACE.

I still remember my last day of work at SFOG. It was Saturday, Spring Fling 2006. That day, Robert surprised me with a gift from ACE Southeast (which still sits on my desk) and we had some of the best coaster rides in memory. The weather was perfect and the crowd a delight to be around. Events with Robert were always easy.

After saying a few final goodbyes I thanked Robert one last time and shook his hand. I left, dropping off to ride Goliath one last time before heading home just after midnight. I did so with my new ACE plaque-clock under my arm. The next morning at 5 a.m. I was on the road to Chicago reporting to work at Six Flags Great America that Monday.

What a ride it's been.
